Description of character of service

Insanity Radio is for students and other young people in Egham and the surrounding area. It offers an educationally-oriented radio service for students and other young people aged 15 to 24, as well as for local residents in Egham more generally. It provides a public forum for students, and works to develop the relationship between student and non-student residents in the area.

The service broadcasts:

- Music. The music broadcast over the course of each week comprises a wide variety of genres, including pop, indie, dance, and urban.
- Speech. The main types of speech output broadcast over the course of each week are: local news and information, event information, discussions, interviews, factual features and educational programming.
- The service provides original output¹ for a minimum of 56 hours per week during term-time and a minimum of 28 hours per week outside of term time.
- The service provides locally-produced output² for a minimum of 13 hours per day.

The studio is located within the licensed coverage area.

The service provides a range of community benefits (social gain objectives mandated by statute) for the target community, both on-air and off-air, and in doing so, achieves the following objectives:

- the facilitation of discussion and the expression of opinion,
- the provision (whether by means of programmes included in the service or otherwise) of education or training to individuals not employed by the person providing the service, and
- the better understanding of the particular community and the strengthening of links within it.

Members of the target community contribute to the operation and management of the service.

The service has mechanisms in place to ensure it is accountable to its target community.
