### Description of character of service

EmouthAiR Radio is for the residents of Exmouth and the surrounding area. It provides a service that is informative, local and relevant to the community, with locally produced programming and which allows residents to air their views, issues and concerns.

The service broadcasts:

- Music. The main type of music broadcast over the course of each week is: pop music from the past 60 years, with a particular emphasis on the 1950s to the 1980s. Specialist music programmes, and local artists also feature.
- Speech. The main types of speech output broadcast over the course of each week are: local news, community information, event information and discussions.
- The service provides original output<sup>1</sup> for a minimum of 12 hours per day.
- The service provides locally-produced output<sup>2</sup> for a minimum of 13 hours per day.

The studio is located within the licensed coverage area.

The service provides a range of community benefits (social gain objectives mandated by statute) for the target community, both on-air and off-air, and in doing so, achieves the following objectives:

- the facilitation of discussion and the expression of opinion,
- the provision (whether by means of programmes included in the service or otherwise) of education or training to individuals not employed by the person providing the service, and
- the better understanding of the particular community and the strengthening of links within it.

Members of the target community contribute to the operation and management of the service.

The service has mechanisms in place to ensure it is accountable to its target community.

<sup>1</sup> Original output is output that is first produced for and transmitted by the service, and excludes output that was transmitted elsewhere before. Original output can be live or voice-tracked. Repeat broadcasts of original output do not count towards the minimum requirement.

<sup>2</sup> Locally-produced output is any output made and broadcast from within the service's licensed coverage area. It may include all types of local production.
